Orchids of the Ible Mountains

A Greentours Trip Report

For the whole week in Sicily we basked under glorious cloudless blue skies, giving superb conditions every day for wildlife viewing.

Our hotel, the Masseria degli Ulivi, was situated among olive groves and flower filled stone walled fields, a very productive habitat. Our initial walks from there yielded many plants and a good selection of birds. This year the hotel was well occupied, there being a different selection of other guests nightly. As always we were well cared for by the staff, enjoying particularly excellent food in the peaceful restaurant.

This is always a perfect time of year to be in Sicily, the rocky limestone fields and flowery roadsides being a fine show of colour from the many species in bloom. Our itinerary combined days locally enjoying these rocky meadows, with trips further afield, to the south coast, Monte Lauro, Pantalica, Syracuse, Priolo wetlands, the disused railway line at Valle dell'Anapo, etc. Not far away was the impressive gorge at Cava Grande di Cassibile.

It is difficult to know how to give an overview of the flowers, as they were many and varied, something over six hundred species being recorded on the tour. Many were particularly characteristic of the Mediterranean spring, such as *Silene colorata*, *Chrysanthemum coronarium*, *Fedia cornucopiae*, *Calendula arvensis*, *Cerintho major*, *Alkanna tinctoria*, *Anemone hortensis*, *Euphorbia characias*, *Echium plantagineum*, *Prasium majus*, and *Smilax aspera*. Legumes were a feature, particularly the beautiful *Pisum sativum*, *Lathyrus clymenum* and *Lathyrus cicera*. The deep red *Tetragonolobus purpureus* was very attractive, but less attractive was the foul smelling Bean Trefoil, rather common near the hotel. Among the many other legumes were *Vicia hybrida*, *Onobrychis caput-galii*, *Scorpiurus muricatus*, *Lotus edulis* and *Psoralea bituminosa*. Two good finds near the hotel were the purple flowered *Scorzonera undulata*, and the diminutive *Convolvulus pentapetaloides*.

Many meadows were awash with Common Asphodel and the Yellow Asphodels seen here and there were very attractive. One of the most beautiful plants in the area is *Salvia fruticosa*, many of which were in flower, the foliage having a pleasant aroma too, and even present on some of the restaurant dishes. *Iris pseudopumila* bloomed in both yellow and purple, and pure purple forms whilst *Cyclamen repandum* was very local but we did see it in bloom. The parasitic *Cytinus ruber* was not uncommon at one site, the waxy plants hidden underneath the cistus bushes they

parasitised. *Linaria triphylla*, *Linaria reflexa* and *Antirrhinum siculum* were all common. The very spiny small shrub *Sarcopoterium spinosum* was a feature of some areas and the attractive wild almond, *Prunus webbii*, was in good flower. This year many *Bellevalia romana* were found in bloom on Monte Lauro. Many of the most interesting plants were rather diminutive, such as *Campanula erinus*, *Saxifraga tridactylites*, and *Asterolinon linum-stellatum*. Other notable plants were *Carduncellus caeruleus*, *Ferulago nodosa*, *Kundmannia sicula*, *Scolymus grandiflorus*, *Arabis verna*, *Ranunculus millefoliatus* and Shrubby Hare's-ear. *Gladiolus italicus* was locally numerous this year, especially on roadsides.

Orchids were a focus of the week, with many species numerous, whilst others were much more local. Species such as *Orchis italica* and *Orchis papilionacea* were very common, whilst Man Orchids were scarce, and *Orchis provincialis* was seen at just one site. Among the Sicilian endemics seen were *Ophrys biancae*, *Ophrys explanata*, *Ophrys flammeola* (a *fusca* type) and *Ophrys lunulata*, whilst *Ophrys oxyrrhynchos* was a near endemic. The brown bee orchids were especially confusing here but following Delforge's intensive splitting approach *Ophrys caesiella*, *Ophrys lucifera* and *Ophrys lupercalis* were determined.

Species of the *exaltata* and *incubacea* groups, namely *Ophrys exaltata*, *Ophrys panormitana*, *Ophrys passionis* subspecies *garganica* and *Ophrys incubacea*, were widespread, and somewhat confusing, and one of the best ways of determining them was to pay special attention to the colour of the pseudo-eyes on either side of the stigmatic cavity.

More widespread Bee Orchids were represented by Sawfly Orchids, Yellow Bee Orchids, Mirror Orchids, Bumble-bee Orchids, and *Ophrys bertolonii*. For me the orchid highlight of the week was the number of Dense-flowered Orchids, a rather small species. This visit no fewer than thirty four were in bloom.

Monte Lauro is the highest point in the Ible Mountains, and although it can be rather cold up here, this year the sunshine meant we were perfectly warm. From here we enjoyed our first stunning views of snow-capped Mount Etna, and we would have many more. On Monte Lauro were fine swathes of *Orchis longicornu* and many Milky Orchids. Also here were several *Romulea bulbocodium*, *Saxifraga graeca* and *Erodium acaule*.

The necropolis of Pantalica provided very impressive views down to the Valle dell'Anapo, and to the beautiful peaceful disused railway line that we would walk later in the week. The tombs cut into the sides of the gorge were first used between the thirteenth and tenth centuries BC by the Sikel, a Bronze Age tribe from the Italian mainland, and there are some five thousand of these tombs here. Tree Spurge characterised the vegetation of this sunny place, with Tree Germander, Roman Nettle, Ramping Fumitory, Caper, and *Micromeria nervosa* among the many other species. Nearby *Cyclamen repandum* and the violet flowered *Viola alba dehnhardtii* were in bloom. A smaller necropolis at Cava Ispica was a pleasing new site for the tour.

A leisurely walk along the Valle dell'Anapo, where Nightingales sang, produced many flowers we had already seen plus new species such as *Ajuga orientalis* and *Anogramma leptophylla*, and Kingfisher was seen.

Row after row of plastic greenhouses characterised the extreme south-east of the island, where crops such as strawberries, tomatoes, and artichokes were intensively grown. On the south coast was a characteristic flora including *Lavatera arborea* in good flower; *Hedysarum glomeratum*;

Ononis natrix; Sea Heath; and the interesting shrub *Thymelaea hirsuta*. The sand dune flora was typical with Sea Medick, Sea Spurge, Cottonweed, Sea Daffodil leaves, and *Lotus cytisoides*. More unusual were *Centaurea sphaerocephala* and *Crucianella maritima*. The beach was covered, as at Vendicari, with washed up debris of the submarine higher plant *Posidonia oceanica*. Time allowed further exploration of the south coast where we found an interesting wetland, and a scenic coast lined with tall sand dunes.

During the week we had enjoyed many superb views of the imposing cone of Mt. Etna. Our visit to the volcano was more of an adventure than is usual this year due to repeated rumblings, thunderings, smoke plumes, and hurled out rocks that were visible through the binoculars. It was quite an experience to be on the mountain today, and the large number of visitors at the busy refugio and tourist shop area were not deterred by the volcanic activity. The extensive black lava slopes gave a beautiful and strange landscape and the impression of this forbidding mountain was very memorable. Mount Etna Broom was dominant over large areas, but not yet in leaf, and the deciduous trees up here were only just in bud also.

Taking a beautiful minor road that skirted the western flank of the volcano, we made several stops having escaped the crowds at the refugio. One beautiful short stroll was amid conifers where Coal Tits were active. Lower down, at our usual lunch-time stop were three of the red form of *Dactylorhiza romana* and a lone red robust Elder-flowered Orchid. Here and nearby were several examples of Giant Orchids still in good condition. Eastern Orange-tip was here as usual, Mt. Etna being the type locality for the species, although only a single male was seen this year. Southern Festoons were on the wing, and we saw their foodplant, *Aristolochia*. Widow Iris was in fine bloom, and *Anchusa cretica*, *Erysimum bonnanianum* and *Vicia leucantha* were among the other flowers in the area. Even lower down the mountain was a small wood in which were blooming several fine *Paeonia mascula*.

One of the orchids of the trip was found on the south-western slopes of Etna, growing in fine patches on the lava. This was the near-endemic *Orchis brancifortii* which we had first found here a few years previously.

The wetlands at Vendicari provided the best birding day of the tour, and we enjoyed superb weather there this year. Unfortunately the unusually high water levels meant few waders were seen, with only Black-winged Stilts, Whimbrel, Grey Plover, and Common Sandpiper being recorded. Two Glossy Ibis was a good record and Squacco Heron was seen very closely. Purple Heron, and Little Egret were the other herons here. Marsh Harrier hunted over the reed beds and some hundred Flamingoes were present in the first lagoon. *Plantago crassifolia*, *Triglochin bulbosa* and the local *Limonium narbonense* were among the wetland plants. On the dunes flowered the beautiful *Acacia cyanophylla* and *Acacia retinoides* as well as some interesting herbaceous species such as *Seseli tortuosum* and *Senecio gallicus*. There was no sign of the hoped for Bee Orchid however, of which we had found one here in a previous year, in early bloom.

The southern end of Vendicari had been closed off since my last visit, prompting an early drive to Isole delle Correnti for a rather windy lunch. Before that we had seen a black Western Whip Snake, the only serpent of the tour, that I managed to coax out of the vegetation for everyone to see.

The explosive song of Cetti's Warbler punctuated the soundtrack to many of the sites we visited, and Zitting Cisticolas performing aerial displays were common. Otherwise among the more interesting and characteristic passerines were Woodlark, Crested Larks, Woodchat Shrike (Ferla), Spotless Starlings, Sardinian, Subalpine and Spectacled Warblers, and Corn and Cirl Buntings. The latter sang daily outside the hotel. Hoopoes were seen occasionally, and Cuckoo called continuously most evenings around the hotel. The highlight of the wetlands at Priolo was two Little Gulls, with pink-tinged Slender-billed Gulls, and Gull-billed and Sandwich Terns here too. Ferruginous Duck was also seen, and the lagoon had much *Zannichellia palustris*.

Butterflies were rather good this year, obviously partly due to the continuous fine weather. Swallowtail, Scarce Swallowtail, Clouded Yellow, Cleopatra, Brimstone, Green Hairstreak, Little Blue, and Green-underside Blue gave no surprises, but more notable was a Nettle-tree Butterfly found near the hotel on the first day. Large Tortoiseshell was a good find on the west slope of Etna, and Comma was on the wing in the Valle dell'Anapo. Perhaps the most notable species was the Dingy Skipper we saw at Priolo, a species apparently not known to occur on the island.

The sunshine brought out the lizards, with Italian Wall Lizard the commonest, several Sicilian Wall Lizards, and the impressive Green Lizard. At the hotel and Priolo were a couple of Moorish Geckos, and Italian Three-toed Skink was noted on the limestone slopes.

This year there was time to visit the Parco Archeologico in Syracuse, where we enjoyed the impressive Teatro Greco, the caves, and the Anfiteatro Romano. The crowds here were especially numerous as 'culture week' meant all such sites on the island had free admission. There were even a few new plants here growing on the ruins, such as *Andrachne telephioides* and *Sideritis romana*.

The last day saw us returning to the impressive new terminal building at Catania airport, saying our farewells before going our separate ways, and reflecting on what an enjoyable and productive week it had been.
