Crocuses and Corsican Nuthatches

A Greentours Trip Report

7th to 14th April 2018

Day 1 Saturday 7th April Arrival

Keith, Eileen, Jeremy and I had arrived from the Sardinia tour the previous day, and had stayed near Bonifacio overnight. A bonus on arrival had been a Common Crane in wetlands west of town, not there on our return a week later. From Bonifacio we had a leisurely drive towards Ajaccio, arriving in the afternoon. Our journey took us through a variety of impressive landscapes and small settlements, and initially along the wild southern coast.

After a supermarket stop to stock up on picnic supplies for the tour, our main stop on Saturday was at the fascinating prehistoric site of Filitosa, deep in the Corsican countryside. Here is the largest statue-menhir on the island, amid several groups of megaliths. There was of course wildlife to see but the Illyrian Sea Daffodils here were still in bud this year, although I persuaded one to open! Among other plants were Roman Nettle, and much White Ball Mustard. The plant highlight was the endemic *Cymbalaria aequitriloba*, first found by us here last year. Ferns were a feature with Jersey Fern, *Asplenium onopteris*, and *Asplenium trichomanes*. Red Kites soared over the site and Sardinian Warblers frequented the scrub. Nearby we ate lunch at a flowery roadside spot.

The journey continued north with fine views of snow-capped mountains. We reached bustling Ajaccio mid-afternoon and negotiated the busy town centre to get to our coastal hotel a little to the west of town. There followed time to relax, catch up on notes, or to explore the environs on foot. Later in the evening I took the Sardinia three to dinner at a nearby restaurant, and then headed for the airport. I arrived to learn that the first flight was delayed. Tyrrhenian Tree Frogs were calling.

In the end both flights arrived at the same time, and once Kurt had collected his vehicle we all headed together for the hotel. Whilst I caught up with preparation late that night I saw a hedgehog snuffling across the patio below my balcony, and a species of pipistrelle.

Day 2 Sunday 8th April La Parata and Journey to Corte

We awoke to fine weather and drove west along the coast road to La Parata. There we walked up onto the rocky headland, which afforded fine views of the red granite lles Sanguinaires below. This was a fine Sunday, but it was not at all too busy here today. It took the combined effort of Kurt, Anne, and Katinka to work out the new computer ticket machines in the car park, totally

beyond me! Dense *Calicotome villosa* scrub characterised the slopes here, and supported Sardinian Warblers. We found many widespread Mediterranean plants, as well as usually scarcer species like *Succowia balearica*, with its distinctive fruits, although this was numerous here today. Both *Mesembryanthemum nodiflorum* and *Mesembryanthemum crystallinum* were in leaf, and *Anthemis maritima*, *Lobularia maritima*, and *Ruta chalepensis* were in flower. *Convolvulus siculus* was very attractive. Plants continued with *Lathyrus clymenum*, *Plantago afra*, and the scarce grass *Piptatherum coerulescens*. Regional endemics Corsican Dappled White and Tyrrhenian Wall Brown were on the wing, and other butterflies included Clouded Yellow, Brown Argus, and Green-underside Blue. Several Humming-bird Hawks were seen. Tyrrhenian Wall Lizards and Moorish Geckos scuttled over the warm rocks and Alpine Swifts sped overhead.

Probably the day's highlight was a collection of very many *Serapias neglecta* in fine flower in one meadow, more than we'd ever seen here. At the same site were *Carex divisa* and *Juncus capitatus* and the quillwort was probably *Isoetes histrix. Carex hirta*, rare here, was found. The orchid list continued with *Orchis papilionacea*, *Orchis morio*, and *Serapias lingua*. Red Kite soared.

Dunes had attractive *Matthiola tricuspidata* and *Silene sericea*, and on rocks nearby was the endemic *Limonium articulatum*. Rated RR (the symbol in the Flora for plants known from fewer than five sites on the island, which we dubbed ridiculously rare) *Orobanche pubescens* parasitised *Sonchus bulbosus* and the commoner *Orobanche ramosa* was here too. We headed a short way inland where we set out the extensive picnic, always especially good in France. Nearby Keith B found Dense-flowered Orchid.

It was time to leave this beautiful place, and head back through busy Ajaccio. We made a short stop at the hotel to collect our luggage. Another short stop yielded an interesting flora including *Linaria pelisseriana*, a red form of *Fumaria capreolata*, *Fumaria bastardii*, *Corrigiola littoralis*, *Paronychia argentea*, and *Spergula arvensis gracilis*. A good find here was the endemic *Linaria flava sardoa*, in good numbers today. Interestingly a couple of days later there appeared in Corse Matin an article on the dune flora of the Ajaccio area with a photo of this tiny toadflax. Cleopatra was here.

Soon we were in a very different world as we climbed steadily up into the mountains. Booted Eagle was seen just east of Ajaccio. *Cyclamen repandum* became common, in fine flower on the roadsides. A stop in still leafless woodland had us admiring the first fine *Helleborus argutifolius* of which we would see very many more. The attractive *Potentilla micrantha*, and *Viola riviniana*, were in flower. At a viewpoint stop, with a fine mountain backdrop, were a few Milky Orchids, and *Gagea granatellii* was in flower this year.

We headed purposefully to our hotel at Corte, and settled in to our fine rooms. We enjoyed a delicious Corsican meal in the adjacent restaurant, beside the rushing river.

Day 3Monday 9th AprilRestonica

We awoke to rain, but managed to avoid the worst of the weather and did all we needed to today. We enjoyed a stunning morning in the Restonica Gorge that stretches above the hotel. I went early into Corte for picnic shopping, from where I was able to see blue sky above Restonica, higher up from the hotel. Our first stop was in extensive Corsican Pine forest in the hope of seeing that gem of an endemic, Corsican Nuthatch. None yet, but Coal Tits and Chaffinches were omnipresent. Many *Helleborus argutifolius* were in flower. Most other things in flower here were diminutive. We enjoyed the pristine habitat and the roaring river. Searching pools beside the river failed to produce the hoped for Corsican Fire Salamander larva or Tyrrhenian Painted Frogs today. Jeremy saw a male Pied Flycatcher.

Further up one bank had a few *Gagea soleirolii* and Common Dog Violets and Sweet Violets were in flower. Common Treecreeper worked the pine trunks. We were soon seeing the first of many *Crocus corsicus*, with hundreds seen today, but all were closed or rain battered today. Crucifers were a feature, among them *Teesdalia coronopifolia*.

Ferns were also rather a feature today, among them Black Spleenwort, *Asplenium onopteris*, Maidenhair Spleenwort, Rustyback Fern, Brittle Bladder Fern, Southern Polypody, Common Polypody, and Soft Shield Fern. Another stop had three *Gagea fistulosa* in flower.

Having reached the refugio where we admired the snow slopes and views above, there was time for a warming coffee. We had reached the community of *Berberis aetnensis* and *Alnus alnobetula* which characterises these altitudes. A waterfall was particularly impressive today.

We decided to drive lower for lunch, where the riverside spot was somewhat warmer. Here the hoped for Corsican Nuthatch called and then a pair was seen well and watched for some time. A tour highlight.

Back past the hotel we dropped off Syd and Anne who were taking the opportunity to visit Corte this afternoon. The rest of us drove to the east of town where a minor road took us into interesting habitat. At the first stop were several *Ophrys incubacea*, and *Ornithogalum umbellatum*. There were a number of earth stars on the grassy banks. Another stop had primroses in flower, not a common species here. There were a few Lady Orchids in early bud. A sunny rocky roadside had a selection of aromatic plants, mostly unpleasant smelling such as *Stachys glutinosa* and *Bupleurum fruticosum*. The diminutive *Linaria arvensis* was the first of several we would see. *Cheilanthes acrostica* was new for the tour. Long-tailed Tits moved through the trees.

In the evening we went through the plant list which covered a surprisingly high percentage of the total, after only two days in the field. Dinner was again superb.

Day 4Tuesday 10th AprilEast Coast etc.

The day was spent completing a circuit down to the east coast and back into the mountains via a beautiful gorge, enjoying a great range of habitat and flora during the day. Initially a short stop was made in Corte to buy fresh picnic supplies.

Once en route the first stop had many fine Green-winged Orchids but no *Dactylorhiza insularis*, a species we had seen in early flower here in the past. Another stop had *Cytisus villosus* and two morels. The interesting legume *Anthyllis hermanniae* was in attractive flower.

We reached the east coast where we explored a large tract of unspoilt dune vegetation. Peas were a feature, among them *Lathyrus angulatus*, *Biserrula pelecinus*, and *Trifolium tomentosum*. Much

Cytinus hypocistus was in tight bud. A *Suillus* was the second interesting fungus today. Marsh Harrier was in the air. We admired a peripatetic flock of beautiful Yellow Wagtails of the nominate race.

Reaching a presumably Napoleonic tower at the south of the promontory we found an interesting dune flora, including *Matthiola sinuata* in flower. On the shore were thousands of *Velella velella*. These are free floating colonial hydrozoans, belonging to the order Chondrophora. I explained the debris of the submarine monocot *Posidonia oceanica* to those unfamiliar with it. *Lonicera implexa* was in flower.

In the dunes, among much *Erodium botrys*, I picked out the more unusual *Erodium lebelii* ssp.*marcuccii*. Otherwise the dunes had the typical community of Sea Holly, Sea Medick, *Medicago littoralis*, *Ononis variegata*, Cottonweed, Sea Daffodil leaves, and *Echinophora spinosa*, as well as *Thymelaea hirsuta*. We set out the lunch and it was enjoyed at this fine peaceful spot. A tiger beetle was one of four possible species in this habitat on Corsica.

No views of Elba today, sometimes visible from this coast. After lunch we headed inland where a series of short stops yielded much of interest. A serpentine outcrop had the endemics *Biscutella rotgesii* and *Senecio serpenticola*. There was one flower on the *Dianthus sylvestris godronianus*. *Stachys glutinosa* was in flower whilst *Teucrium marum* was just coming into bloom. *Pancratium illyricum* was in impressive flower, and some walked up to it for photos. *Notholaena marantae* was an attractive fern and locally common here. Many more *Linaria arvensis* were here and *Vicia laeta* was new for the tour. A few *Brimeura fastigiata* were in flower. A highlight for me was a lethargic European Leaf-toed Gecko that I spotted sitting on the rocks. This is a regional endemic, and is predominantly nocturnal. This was a very special find. In the Inzecca gorge, itself impressive, the endemic *Brassica insularis* was very floriferous today, and *Viola kitaibeliana* was seen. Further on a young Wild Boar crossed the road, probably the last of several.

The journey became very spectacular as we climbed slowly up a very good almost deserted road to a col with ever finer views of the snow capped peaks and lower mountains all around us. *Muscari botryoides* was at a short photo stop. Another vigil for Corsican Nuthatch failed to produce this special endemic today at what is another regular site for it.

Day 5 Wednesday 11th April Col de Verghio

Rain was the order of the day but we still reached the intended Col, although found it cold and wet today.

From Corte we first headed north a short way before turning west to approach the beautiful scenery of the Scala de Santa Regina. At the first stop were a few *Ophrys incubacea* and Greenwinged Orchids. The first of three saxifrages today was much *Saxifraga tridactylites* in flower. A few more earth stars were here.

A usually reliable Corsican Swallowtail stop was much too wet and cold today for any of this endemic to be on the wing. *Tanacetum audibertii* was in leaf. In the gorge *Saxifraga cervicornis* was in impressive bloom. With the saxifrage grew the endemics *Coincya monensis recurvata* and *Barbarea*

rupicola. Armeria leucocephala was in bud this year. Anne spotted *Orchis olbiensis* in fine flower. Crag Martins were in the air.

Next, a short riverside stroll yielded several *Gagea villosa*, but the third saxifrage of the morning, *Saxifraga corsica* was only in bud. Wild Celery was in leaf under the trees, and the lovely little *Arenaria balearica* was admired. Also in leaf was *Hypericum hircinum* and *Alyssum alyssoides* was another new crucifer.

My regular site for Corsican Finch did not disappoint, with a good number here today. They were peripatetic but gathered particularly in one tree and were seen well in the telescope. Common Treecreeper was here too. Free range mostly black pigs scuffled around. Soon we were in extensive Corsican Pine forest, the mistletoe *Viscum album* ssp.*austriacum* becoming common on the pines. Crocuses were notably much less numerous on the roadsides here than is usual at this time, although again most were closed in the cool weather. There was much remaining snow on the roadsides. Heavy rain began and was persistent.

The Col de Verghio was cold and wet. Things were very backward here, the snow having only just gone. Jeremy found the hoped for *Gagea lutea* although only in bud. *Corydalis pumila* was in leaf, as was the low very spiny *Rosa serafinii*. All the crocuses were still of course closed.

We headed down some way to find a more or less dry picnic spot. Red-legged Partridges were here. We explored a scenic drive on the way back to Corte.

Meanwhile today Syd had enjoyed an extracurricular scenic train journey from Corte to Bastia and back, a very worthwhile excursion by all accounts.

This was our last night in Restonica.

Days 6 & 7 Thursday 12th & Friday 13th April Journey to Bonifacio, and Bonifacio area

Saying farewell to Restonica we again drove down to the east coast, rather purposefully today as there was much to see later in the day. Red Kites were as usual a feature of the journey.

Having reached the coast, and finding a quiet beach for a short break, we found a meadow with fine *Orchis laxiflora*, vast numbers of *Serapias lingua*, several *Serapias parviflora*, and fine *Serapias cordigera*. There was much *Romulea columnae rollii* in fruit. The cone shell I found on the shore here was *Conus mediterraneus*, one of only three species in the Med and the only one this far north. Here was a poignant memorial to the liberation of Corsica, in 1943. Corsica was the first department of metropolitan France to be liberated.

Further south another quiet bay supported a small patch of native vegetation that had escaped the extensive coastal development, and here survived the endangered endemic *Anchusa crispa*, which was in fine flower today. However it took some finding this year. In 2015 we had seen fifteen plants, in 2016 were only two, and some six in 2017. This year we found three. Poppies featured with Yellow Horned Poppy, *Hypecoum procumbens*, and naturalised *Eschscholzia californica* all here.

At the lunch site were very many *Serapias lingua*, more *Orchis laxiflora*, *Lathyrus aphaca*, and more *Aristolochia rotunda insularis* than we had seen before. Buttercups here included *Ranunculus muricatus*, *Ranunculus sardous*, *Ranunculus paludosus*, and *Ranunculus velutinus*. Finally we found *Juncus pygmaeus*, and Round-headed Club-rush was seen. Cetti's Warbler called and this was the first and only place we heard Cuckoo. Kurt saw egg laying Large Tortoiseshell.

The afternoon was spent exploring the fascinating limestone habitats of this extreme south-eastern corner of the island. A very productive roadside had many orchids, among them *Ophrys panormitana praecox*, *Ophrys tenthredinifera*, *Ophrys corsica*, *Ophrys bombyliflora*, and Man Orchid. There were many cyclamen, anemones, and *Arabis sagittata*. Kurt took a particular dislike to a small snail on the naturalised *Lilium candidum*, the snail was *Vitrina pellucida*!

One of the botanical highlights of the area is *Simethis mattiazii*, Kerry Lily, locally rather common here. Wet hollows usually have *Isoetes histrix*, but very wet today we found very small *Plantago weldenii* instead. Cistus in fine flower was a feature, with *Cistus creticus*, *Cistus monspeliensis*, and *Cistus salvifolius* all in bloom. *Allium roseum* was common in the area, here being the endemic *insulare* subspecies. The endemic *Ferula arrigonii* was in flower on roadsides. *Serapias cordigera* was impressive.

Checking first to see if the Common Crane was still in residence (it was not) we headed towards our hotel, in a tranquil bay amid pines. Dinner was enjoyed and tonight we were almost the only guests.

Moths on the hotel walls included Puss Moth, Shuttle-shaped Dart, and Oak Beauty.

We awoke to completely calm conditions and superb weather. A stop in beautiful Bonifacio allowed for a wander around the harbour, the impressive old town above, whilst Kurt and I quickly stocked up on fresh picnic supplies. I will not name the member of the party who attempted to get cash from the car park ticket machines! *Hedysarum glomeratum* flowered on the limestone cliffs.

The morning was spent exploring the fascinating limestone habitats around Bonifacio. The flora was notably different from any we had yet seen. Phoenician Juniper was a feature of the area and we were soon struck by the many impressive large hummocks of *Astragalus massiliensis* so characteristic here on the open slopes.

We walked a limestone gully down to coastal cliffs. Fine *Matthiola tricuspidata* and *Asteriscus maritimus* were in flower, and the endemic *Morisia monanthos* (also on Sardinia) was in fine flower. The highlight for me was the simply superb *Erodium corsicum* in beautiful condition. The endemic *Limonium obtusifolium*, the pink flowered *rubriflora* subspecies of Kidney Vetch, and *Thymelaea hirsuta* were here too. *Narcissus tazetta* was still in bloom, but most of the *Pancratium illyricum* was in leaf or bud. *Romulea requienii* flowered in rock crevices, *Pseudorlaya pumila* was in leaf, and there was *Senecio cineraria*. As already said, strong winds characterise this coast, but today there was not even a light breeze. Looking out over the channel we'd crossed by ferry from Sardinia the other day, we had views of that island, saw the morning ferry, and watched Cory's and Yelkouan Shearwaters over the water.

At another stop were more *Morisia monanthos* and we watched a dung beetle.

Lunch was set out behind a beach which afforded fine views of the Lavezzi Islands. *Gladiolus dubius* was in flower. Nearby was *Vicia altissima*. Katinka collected shells, including *Haliotis lamellosa*, the Green Ormer, lined with mother-of-pearl, with a row of small holes, and Mediterranean Limpet.

Orchids featured at the next stop. There were the regional endemics *Ophrys corsica*, *Ophrys marmorata*, and *Ophrys morisii*, and *Ophrys incubacea* was rather common. Bithynian Vetch and *Ononis reclinata* were in flower. Above the cliffs was *Echium parviflorum*. *Matthiola incana* bloomed on cliffs near town.

Later in the afternoon we called at the Bonifacio ferry terminal so I could buy a ticket for tomorrow. I was told no tickets were on sale as it would be the captain's decision in the morning whether or not the ship would sail, as severe weather was expected. This set me worrying as I had made the crossing more than once in very rough conditions indeed. Just how bad must it be for the crossing to be cancelled! At Trinite de Bonifacio were more fine views of Sardinia, and a different aspect of Bonifacio. Here we added a few new weedy species to the plant list! Before dinner we caught up with all checklists. We enjoyed the last dinner, the hotel full tonight, and said our sad farewells with appreciation speeches after a really enjoyable week.

Day 8 Saturday 14th April Departure

Flights were from Filitosa Airport, conveniently not far from the hotel. Kurt was in charge of the airport transfers as Jeremy and I left early to hopefully catch the first ferry. Despite the winds, the ferry would indeed sail. Amazingly the crossing was remarkably smooth, despite the strong wind and white waves. We had the usual good views of Cory's and Yelkouan Shearwaters. Many *Pancratium illyricum* were in bloom as we approached the harbour.

From Sta.Teresa I drove again the length of the island. A detour was well worthwhile especially for the superb *Paeonia morisii* in flower. There were several Corsican Finches. We reached Cagliari late afternoon. There we stayed overnight in a good hotel, and enjoyed a fine dinner. Our flights were the following morning.

Systematic List Number 1 Plants

The order generally follows Flora Europaea, although within each family species are listed alphabetically. 'Flora Corsica' by Jeanmonod and Gamisans, SBCO, 2nd Edition, 2013, is the standard work. 'La Vegetation de la Corse' by J.Gamisans, 1999, and 'La Flore Endemique de la Corse' by J.Gamisans and J.Marzocchi, 1996, are both invaluable excellent works. The recent French flora, 'Flora Gallica' by Tison and de Foucault, Biotope Editions, 2014, is also invaluable. New species continue to be added to the list, and additions this year are annotated 2018.
